ENROLLMENT

This year enrollment will be held on August 3, 2010, from 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM and 3:00 PM - 7:00 PM at all schools. Students enrolling in the district for the first time should bring their immunization records, birth certificate, health assessment or physical exam forms and social security card.

NON RESIDENT STUDENTS

All non-resident students must receive pre-approval from the superintendent of schools prior to enrollment. This includes all students who previously attended the Baldwin schools but will not reside/live within the district boundaries on the first day of school (August 18). This summer seems to be flying by and the first day of school is just around the corner. Staff have been working on the maintenance of our buildings. Organizing schedules, cleaning, and preparing for a significant move from the old Primary Center to the New Primary Center is keeping them very busy. We are all looking forward to another great school year.

As most of you know our district has been dealing with the economic times just as all of us have. We have faced unprecedented reductions in budget due to a shortage in state revenues. We have adjusted our budget and tightened our belts. We are preparing for possible reductions this year and next. The school board and district staff have spent a considerable amount of time planning for these and future reductions. Hopefully we are looking for better financial days for everyone.

Building projects continue to progress. The baseball/softball complex is essentially finished and operational. I know many of you have enjoyed the use of them this summer through the recreation programs. The new primary center is moving quickly toward completion and will hopefully be operational by the start of school in August. Many details are being dealt with on almost a daily basis. Due to the completion schedule, enrollment for the primary center will take place at the old primary center located at 700 Chapel. Construction on the performing arts center began this spring but has been slowed by the wet summer. Sometime near Mid-July the large crane will begin installing the concrete panels that make-up the outside shell of the new structure. Their plan is to have these large panels installed before school starts in August. The completion date for the new performing arts center will be sometime next summer. The new track is finished north of the high school. It is available for the public to use for walking or running. We just ask that there be no cleats, bikes, rollerblades, or motorized vehicles on the track as they damage the surface.

Frequently asked questions: How are the textbook and activity user fees used?

Textbook fees are used to purchase new textbooks. This includes workbooks and supplemental book materials as well as the actual textbook. Textbooks are very expensive and run anywhere from \$100 - \$200 a piece. We have a review rotation of curriculum and its materials and when a content area comes up for review we use the textbook fees plus general fund money to purchase new textbooks and materials.

Activity user fees are used to support extra-curricular activities. The user fees help pay coach and sponsor salaries, buy new equipment, new uniforms, pay utilities, and many other related expenses.

FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATIONS

Free and Reduced Lunch Applications will be available on August 3 during enrollment. They will also be available in each schools main office after enrollment.

TEXTBOOKS

All basic textbooks, workbooks, newspapers, etc. required by the school district will be provided by the school on a rental use basis. Assignment fees will be as follows:

Kindergarten \$40.00
Grades 1-5 \$50.00
Grades 6-8 \$70.00
Grades 9 -12 \$90.00
Band Instruments \$30.00

ACTIVITY USER FEE

Individuals participating in school activities will be charged an activity user fee. To many Kansans, the activity fee is equated with “pay to play”. Students in competitive activities that involve travel to other schools at the high school and junior high level will be charged \$40.00 per person, per activity. This also includes Scholars Bowl. All high school sports, as well as all junior high school sports (not intramural) will be assessed the fee.

ACTIVITY TICKETS

Activity tickets for high school and junior high school activities may be purchased during enrollment. High school activity tickets are \$25.00 for students, \$35.00 for adults. Activity tickets presented at the gate admit the holder to all regular scheduled activities excluding tournaments and playoffs.

ACTIVITY ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Accident insurance coverage through the Kansas State High School Activities Association covers all students participating in inter-scholastic activities. This is a secondary insurance and covers some medical bills not covered by your primary insurance policy. It is the family’s responsibility to file all claims. To obtain a claim form, please contact the activities office at 785-594-2727.

PHYSICAL NEEDED

All students planning to participate in any inter-scholastic activity, grades 7-12, must have a completed and fully signed KSHSAA physical exam form turned in to the BHS office or the BJHS office before the first practice. This form must be signed by the doctor, parent and athlete. Physical exams are not needed for P.E. classes. The first day of practice for fall sports will be August 18. FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS & PRIVACY ACT

For purpose of FERPA, USD 348 has designated certain information contained in educational records as directory information, which may be disclosed for any purpose without your consent. The following information is considered directory information: name, address, telephone numbers, date and place of birth, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous school attended by the student, class designation, major field of study, and photographs. You have a right to refuse to permit the designation of any or all of the above information as directory information. If you refuse, you must file written notification to this effect with USD 348 on or before the first day of school. If a refusal is not filed, USD 348 assumes that there is no objection to the release of the directory information designated.

NONDISCRIMINATION NOTICE

In attendance with federal and state law, it is the policy of USD 348 that no student applicant, employee or other person will be discriminated against or harassed on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, age or disability. This policy covers all aspects of admission, access, treatment and employment in all school district programs and activities. USD 348 has procedures regarding the referral, evaluation and placement of individuals with disabilities who are eligible for services under federal law.

SPECIAL EDUCATION INFORMATION

Federal and state laws guarantee "a free appropriate public education" to all children with disabilities, regardless of the severity. These laws apply to all children who have visual, auditory, health or physical impairments, as well as those who have speech and language, emotional and learning disabilities and those who are mentally retarded. The law also requires that, "to the maximum extent appropriate, handicapped children, are educated with children who are not handicapped." The East Central Kansas Cooperative in Education provides special education to student's ages 3-21 with special needs in the Baldwin, Eudora and Wellsville School Districts. The ECK Cooperative employs school psychologists, speech therapists, occupational and physical therapists, social workers, as well as a number of special education teachers trained to work with various exceptionalities. The Cooperative also serves children with high intellectual ability by providing enrichment and accelerated activities to augment the school's curriculum. If you have questions or concerns about your child's needs and live in the Baldwin, Eudora, or Wellsville school districts, contact the East Central Kansas Cooperative in Education at 785-594-2737, or your school principal.

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Student files maintained by the East Central Kansas Cooperative in Education are considered to be confidential. Safeguards and procedures to govern access of pupil records to all parents have been established within the schools and the Cooperative Office. These procedures are consistent with the intent of the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) as amended and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Special education files are maintained at the Cooperative Office by the director of the Cooperative and in each of the schools of participating districts by the building principals. A list of the types and locations of education records collected, used and maintained by the Cooperative as well as the officials responsible is available to parents or eligible student upon request. Records shall be released without prior consent only to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official has a legitimate education interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the Cooperative discloses education records without consent to officials or another school district in which a student intends to seek to enroll. Under regulations of IDEA, parents or eligible students have the right to: a) inspect and review the student's record; b) request an amendment of the student's education records; c) refuse to consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information, except to the extent that federal laws authorize disclosure without consent; d) file a complaint with the Kansas State Board of Education or the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures to comply with state and federal confidentiality policies and procedures. Policies are in English but may be translated if needed. Contact the Cooperative Office at 785-594-2737 for further information.

ASBESTOS INFORMATION

The management Plan for Asbestos in School is located in the principal's office in each attendance center and in the District Office. Also, the abatement project manuals for Baldwin High School Industrial Arts building and Baldwin Elementary Primary Center are located in the District Office. Anyone who would like to review these plans is invited to make the request in person at the appropriate center during business hours Monday through Friday. Section 763.85 (b) or the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) requires that re-inspections be done "at least every three years". The first 3-year re-inspection was completed June 1, 1992. The second re-inspection was completed June 5, 1995. The third re-inspection was completed December 9, 1997. The fourth re-inspection was completed May 15, 2001. The fifth re-inspection was completed June 16, 2004. The sixth re-inspection was completed December 18, 2006.

BACK TO SCHOOL ASSISTANCE

Through the generosity of several local organizations, assistance is available to help a limited number of USD 348 families get started with school. If you would like assistance in obtaining school supplies and some back to school basics, please contact the school social worker that serves your child's school.

FREE SCREENING FOR CHILDREN UNDER 5 YEARS OF AGE

USD 348 and the East Central Kansas Cooperative in Education conduct screenings for children under 5 years of age. The next screening will be August 19 at BES-PC. Areas screened include: motor skills, self-help skills, speech-language skills, personal-social skills, pre-academic skills, hearing and vision. Please call the BES-PC office at 594-2444 to schedule an appointment.

IMMUNIZATIONS

If you received a letter from the nurse last spring regarding your child and a need for an immunization, it will be due at the time of enrollment. You must bring written documentation that your child received the immunization. If this is not completed, your child will not be able to attend school or any extra-curricular activities. Our district must comply with this State regulation. The Health Department advises that you add a small bottle of hand sanitizer to your list of school supplies. Good hand hygiene is a quick and easy way to help keep your child healthy.

TRANSPORTATION NEWS

Just a reminder that all students riding a bus other than their own, must either have a note or a phone call to the bus garage, 594-RIDE (7433). Also, check with Ernie Gwin for lost and found items left on the bus.

The Food Service Program uses a computerized Point of Service system. Each student in the district has been entered into the system and assigned a unique identification number. Money may be placed into a student's account in advance and as the student purchases meals and ala carte items, their account will be debited. Students must have money in their accounts to purchase food items.

If the student's account balance falls below -\$10.00 (Elementary) or -\$5.00 (Secondary) , the student will not be allowed to purchase a meal, until the account balance is brought back up above the -\$5.00 amount. When a student's account balance is below the designated amount, the student will be given a sack lunch containing a cheese sandwich, fruit, & milk. The student's account will not be charged for this sack lunch.

For ala carte purchases, the student's account must have a positive balance. This balance must be enough to cover the entire ala carte purchase.

Free and reduced priced meals are available for families who qualify. Applications are available at each school and at the District Office. Applications may take up to 2 days to process. Incomplete applications cannot be processed, due to KSDE regulations. If you are unsure of how to properly fill out your application, please ask for help from office staff or contact Julie Henry, the Food Service Director.

You can see your student's account balance and view account transactions for free by signing up at www.ezschooldpay.com. You may also deposit money into accounts using a credit card at www.ezschooldpay.com. All you will need to enroll is your student's Powerschool ID number and an e-mail address.

LINK CREW PROGRAM

BHS participates in the nationwide Link Crew Program, an organization whose sole purpose is to help freshmen feel more comfortable as well as help them achieve success in their first year of high school. The Link Crew freshman orientation and transition program is designed to both welcome and support freshmen by assigning them a junior or senior Link Crew Leader as a mentor during this first year. This Link Leader is a responsible older student who was hand selected from a large pool of applicants and has met the qualifications of being a good role model and a positive leader on our campus.

DUAL ENROLLMENT THROUGH JCCC

JCCC offers Baldwin High students college credit in the following classes: Composition I, Composition II, College Algebra and Calculus. If your child has not met the ACT score requirements to enroll in the class, they will need to take the COMPASS test at the JCCC Testing Center. The deadline for application and test score submission is September 1st. Enrollment and tuition payment is due September 14th. Students will be given more information the first week of class.

TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL SCHOOL YEAR by *John Tompkins*

1. Power of a positive attitude

In the several years Pat Montgomery was principal at Angleton High School, she always would end the morning announcements saying, "This is your opportunity to have a good day or not. The choice is yours." Montgomery said she firmly believes a positive outlook on the school year can bring a positive experience for students. "Expect the best from themselves and their teachers," she said. "People have a tendency to live up to their expectations."

2. Hit the ground running

One thing students always should be prepared for at the beginning of the year is to be ready to start learning on the first day, said Catherine Ryan, a science teacher at Alvin High School. Students often think the first day is about just getting familiar with their teachers and new surroundings and not homework, she said. They need to be prepared and expect to learn the first day. "Bring a pen," Ryan said emphatically. "They don't expect to do a darn thing all day." Being a science teacher, Ryan added that students should have an open mind about their classes, even if they've had a bad experience in previous classes.

3. Don't starve yourself

Before students can fill their minds with an education, they need to fill their bellies with the most important meal of the day, said Christy Koury, a director of child nutrition services. "I think it is important for kids to eat breakfast," Koury said. Students need to make sure their lunch accounts are full ahead of time and applications for reduced lunch are turned in as soon as possible. "The first week is a learning time period for all of us," she said. "o make sure their lunch accounts are full ahead of time and applications for reduced lunch are turned in as soon as possible. 4. Beware what you wear

Students can spend a lot of time in a principal's office if their clothes don't meet the district's dress code, said Jay Luce, a board president. Dress codes are established to help prepare students for the working world, where they will have to watch the threads they choose to don, he said. "It's a continuous hassle," he said. "Buy clothes that meet the dress code." Adhering to the dress code will mean more time spent in the classroom and not in trouble with administration, he said. Luce also advised students to show up to school every day with a positive attitude toward their education.

5. Respect and responsibility

The key to a good school year and a good education boils down to two words, said Steve Galloway, principal at Columbia High School. "Respect and responsibility," he said. "Those two words can cover everything you need." Whether it's picking up trash found on a sidewalk or following through with things students promise to do, students can start the year off right keeping those two words in mind, he said. "It's not only going to make your school year good, it will help with your relationships with friends and your relationships with your family," Galloway said.

6. Avoid senioritis

When seniors start off their last year, they often think it's time to slow down and take things easy before the start of college, said John Taylor, a 2007 high school graduate. Much of the year is about working hard and celebrating the end of their high school days, but the work shouldn't be ignored, he said. Colleges will pay attention to how that last year is spent, he said. "You have to work hard to celebrate," Taylor said. "Stay strong and finish strong. Colleges look at your senior year, too."

7. Use your resources

Students are given planners to track important due dates and test dates. Encourage your student to use their planner to stay organized. Parents and students should become familiar with Power School to keep track of your student's grades and attendance. Also, students should utilize after school tutoring.

8. It's about communication

Parents need to take an active interest in their student's education and one of the biggest ways they can ensure their students have a good school year, is by talking to them, said Ryan. Parents also need to maintain good communication with their students' teachers and counselor, she said.

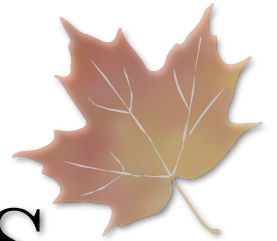
